A restored World War II era M4A3 tank graces the NYS Military Museum's front lawn. An exciting winter lecture series attracts an average of 75 visitors to each program. The Medal of Honor finally awarded to Henry Johnson of the famous Harlem Hellfighters for his World War I heroics is now part of the collection of the NYS Military Museum and is on exhibit at the Capitol. The Military Museum's website has grown to over 5,000 pages and receives at least 80,000 views per month. A major new exhibit on the Korean and Vietnam Wars is in the works to open this fall. And the Night at the Brewseum is just weeks away!

These are just a few of the many on-going activities and recent achievements at the New York State Military Museum. Committed to telling the story of New York State's rich military history and the service and sacrifice of its citizens, the Military Museum continues to expand its exhibitions and program offerings each year. Military Museum scheduled to open new Korean War/Vietnam War Exhibit

The New York State Military and the Friends of the New York State Military Museum are proud to announce the development of a new exhibit scheduled to open this fall at the Military Museum.

"Hot Spots in the Cold War", a new exhibition now in development at the New York State Military Museum, will examine the origins and outcomes of America's involvement in Korea and Vietnam, with a particular emphasis on the contributions and experiences of New York veterans. In addition, the exhibition will also explore the domestic impact of the Cold War from the pervasive fear of global nuclear warfare to the debates and protest that divided the nation at the height of the war in Vietnam. "Hot Spots in the Col War" will provide a general narrative of the causes and course of each war, broadly examining America's political and military response within the context of the Cold War and a policy of containment of the spread of communism. Interwoven within this framework, the exhibition will also evaluate the American Cold War mentality and present the social and political effects of the wars at home, including the Red Scare of the 1950s.

We are now in the process of securing funding for this exhibit. Stay tuned for more information in our next newsletter.
